All In Need

Children, all children, are a gift from the Lord and all children are special. Every parent knows that. Yet for some parents, bringing these gifts into the world has brought with it additional challenges and needs.

All in Need Ministry helps support and show Christ's love to children with disabilities ages (3tt-5th grade) by providing respite care for families who do not qualify for services through other agencies.

All in Need Respite Care offers a safe, loving, and learning environment. Care is provided the first Friday night of the month and includes childcare for special needs kids and their siblings as well as support time for families. This free 3 hour program allows parents to go out on a date or take time with their typical developing child.

Childcare for typical developing children is also available with advance notice. Participants should contact the coordinator for information and hourly rate.

An application must be filled out for all special needs children before beginning respite care program.

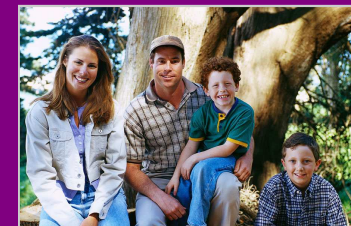
